

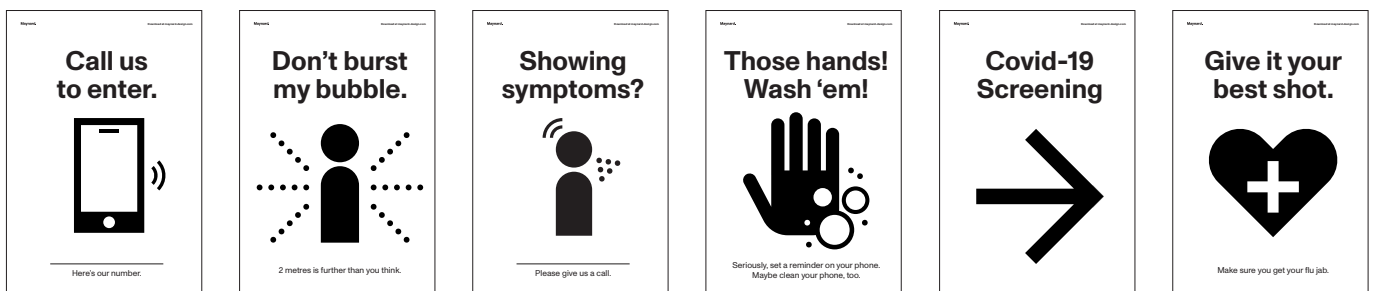

## Covid-19 Toolkit

### Covid-19 Guidance Posters

Use this guide to print and install Covid-19 messaging in essential health services and businesses.

#### Posters to print from this toolkit:



Display clearly at entrance.

Display at entrance and congested areas.


Display clearly at entrance.

Display at exit.

Arrow + caption options for directing patients.

Display in staff facing areas to encourage flu vaccines.

#### How to use this toolkit:

<p><b>Step 1:</b> Printing the posters</p>	<p><b>Step 2:</b> Identifying the best locations to install</p>	<p><b>Step 3:</b> Install the posters to weather and last</p>	<p><b>Step 4:</b> Installation best-practice</p>
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Print at 100% on <b>A4 paper</b>, or 200% on <b>A3 paper</b>.</li> <li>Print all posters on <b>fluro yellow paper</b> for best effect.</li> <li>Print all posters on the same paper stock for consistency.</li> </ul> <p><b>Tip:</b> Check your local stationery store for fluro paper delivery.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Place posters where they will have most impact.</li> </ul> <p>For example:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Place public bench messaging on/by the bench, not at the entrance to the park.</li> </ul> <p><b>Tip:</b> Don't bombard people with too many messages at once. (Max: 3)</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Install in sheltered areas where possible.</li> <li>Install on the inside of glass where possible.</li> <li>Laminate posters if possible for outdoor areas.</li> <li>Install straight and cleanly with strong clear or black tape.</li> </ul> <p><b>Tip:</b> Reduce lamination costs and waste by only laminating posters that could get rained on.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Install at eye-level. <b>1.4m</b> is the optimum height.</li> </ul>  <p><b>Tip:</b> Remove other unimportant posters that distract from Covid-19 messaging.</p>

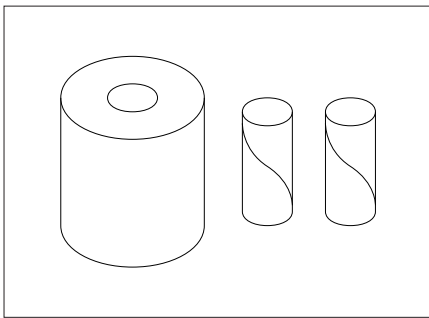

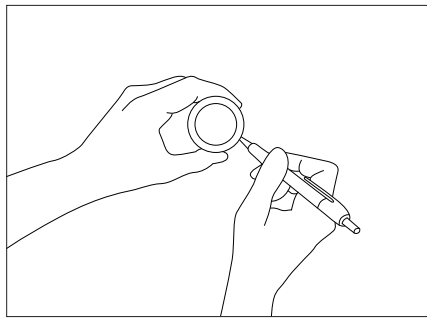
### Don't have a printer?

Use this guide to create your own posters. You will need two toilet paper rolls, a pencil, a black marker, paper and a pair of scissors.

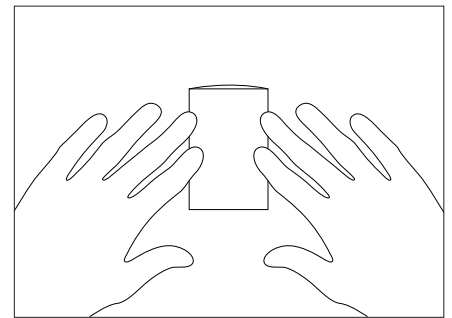
### Create your shapes:



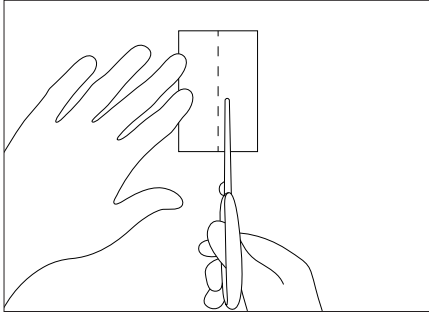
You will need two empty toilet rolls



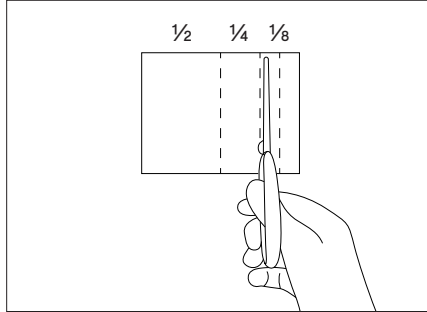
Use one roll to draw circles



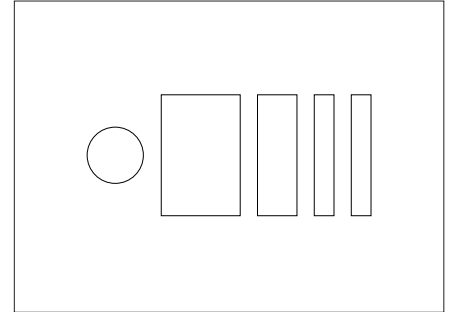
Fold the second roll in half



Cut along one of the fold lines



Open and cut into  $\frac{1}{2}$ ,  $\frac{1}{4}$  and two  $\frac{1}{8}$ 's



Use these shapes to create pictograms

### How to draw your own posters:

**1. Outline and combine shapes with pencil.**

Leave space for large message

Leave space for small message

**2. Fill in the shapes with a black marker.**

**3. Use the rectangle to align the height of letters.**
