Covid-19 Toolkit

Covid-19 Guidance Posters

Use this guide to print and install Covid-19 messaging in and around school grounds.

Posters to print from this toolkit:



Display at pick-up / drop-off areas.


Display at entrances to areas where parents are not allowed.

Display with hand sanitiser.

Display in quiet areas - separate to critical messaging.

Wayfinding arrows.

How to use this toolkit:

Step 1: Printing the posters	Step 2: Identifying the best locations to install	Step 3: Install the posters to weather and last	Step 4: Installation best-practice
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Print at 100% on A4 paper, or 200% on A3 paper. • Print all posters using a colour printer. • Print all posters on the same paper stock for consistency. <p>Tip: Only print the posters you need to use, in order to reduce waste.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Place posters where they will have most impact. <p>For example:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Place public bench messaging on/by the bench, not at the entrance to the park. <p>Tip: Don't bombard people with too many messages at once.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Install in sheltered areas where possible. • Install on the inside of glass where possible. • Laminate posters if possible for outdoor areas. • Install straight and cleanly with strong clear or black tape. <p>Tip: Reduce lamination costs and waste by only laminating posters that could get rained on.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Install at eye-level. 1.4m is the optimum height.  <p>Tip: Remove other unimportant posters that distract from Covid-19 messaging.</p>

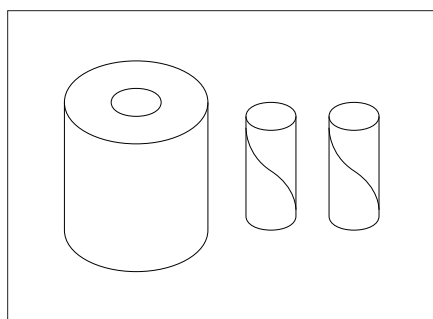

Recreatable notices

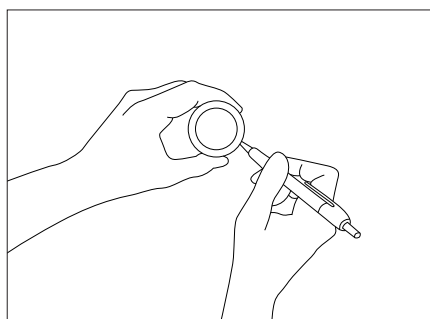
Don't have a printer?

Use this guide to create your own posters. You will need two toilet paper rolls, a pencil, a black marker, paper and a pair of scissors.

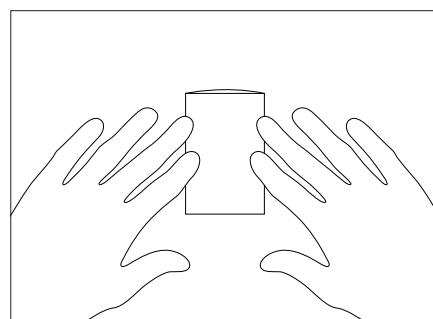
Create your shapes:



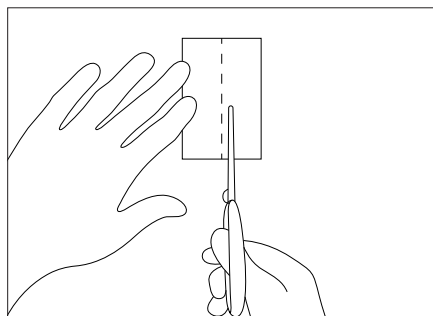
You will need two empty toilet rolls



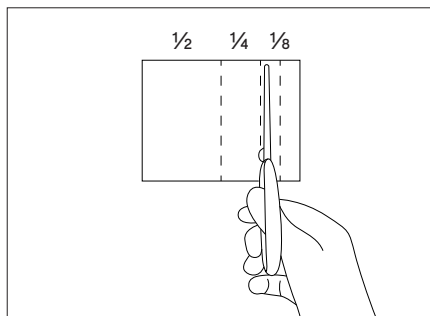
Use one roll to draw circles



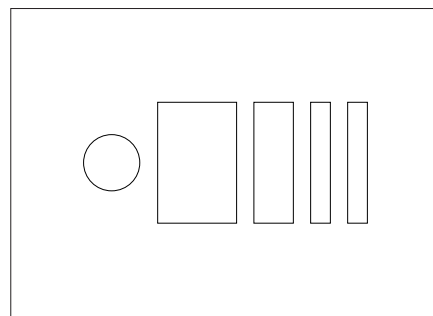
Fold the second roll in half



Cut along one of the fold lines



Open and cut into $\frac{1}{2}$, $\frac{1}{4}$ and two $\frac{1}{8}$'s



Use these shapes to create pictograms

How to draw your own posters:

1. Outline and combine shapes with pencil.

Leave space for large message

Leave space for small message

2. Fill in the shapes with a black marker.

3. Use the rectangle to align the height of letters.
